Please let us know you are coming by December 12. So looking forward to this!




### League Memberships Make Great Gifts!

### League to Hold Listening Sessions with Membership

Last summer, the League hosted listening sessions in support of the ACLU's efforts to identify priorities for 2023. A wonderful thing happened along the way. During those few hours as we answered questions about our communities and life experiences, we got to

know each other at a deeper level. We connected. Some of those who participated thought it would be a good idea to invite the entire membership to engage in similar discussions. The DEI committee agreed, and a planning committee was born! Since this effort is being supported by the DEI committee, the discussions will place an emphasis on Diversity. Understanding each individual is unique and that by recognizing individual differences and similarities we add to the richness of the League experience. The DEI committee's goals are for members to:

- Get to know each other at a deeper level
- Learn about issues that are important to members and their communities, and
- Move toward action At "Reaching Across the Aisle"

Ambassador Tony Hall shared stories of the past when elected officials socialized; their kids went to school together; their spouses were friends. Shared dinners, family trips and kids' sports events led to friendships resulting in a willingness to work together toward the common good. He said, (and I'm paraphrasing) that in order to drive change, we need to be "vulnerable," accept our differences and celebrate our similarities.

During our first committee meeting, we asked the group what they liked about the conversations. They told us that they enjoyed getting to know each other at a different level; that the discussions were "authentic" and "real." One committee member said, "These are the conversations we really need to have."

The plan is to get these conversations started in March. The committee is still working out the details, but we hope that when you get a phone call inviting you to participate, you'll consider it.
