

LOCAL BALLOT ISSUES GREENE COUNTY

This list includes all the ballot issues for Greene County. Each issue applies to a specific community or school district. Your ballot will have only the issues for your community or school district.

Issue 1: City of Fairborn Income Tax - Street Construction and Maintenance

This issue would continue the $\frac{1}{4}$ % income tax for street construction and maintenance. The money would be used to build and fix streets in the city. It **would not increase** the income tax.

Issue 2: City of Fairborn Income Tax – Safety and Emergency Services

This issue would continue the $\frac{1}{4}$ % income tax for safety and emergency services and maintenance. The money would be used to fund the police department, the fire department, and the paramedic service. It **would not increase** the income tax.

Issue 3: City of Xenia Police Levy

This issue would increase the property tax rate to provide money for the police department to buy equipment, pay staff, and provide police protection for the city of Xenia. It **would increase** property taxes for the average homeowner by about \$140 a year.

Issue 4: Village of Jamestown Emergency Services Levy

This issue would increase the property tax rate to provide money for the police and fire departments. The money would be used to buy equipment, pay staff, and provide police and fire protection and emergency medical help for the village. It **would increase** property taxes for the average homeowner by about \$130 a year.

Issue 5: Greeneview Local School District Bond Issue and Tax Levy

This issue would let the school district borrow about \$20 million to build and improve school buildings. It would also increase property taxes to provide money to support school construction. It **would increase** property taxes for the average homeowner by about \$200 a year.

Issue 6: Yellow Springs School District Tax Levy

This issue would replace the current school district property tax with a new tax to provide money to operate the schools. It would cost the average homeowner about \$315 a year, instead of the current property tax amount..
